INTRODUCTION

GOSPEL (LUKE 1:39-45)

After the angel Gabriel had appeared to Mary, she set off at once to visit her cousin, Elizabeth. When Elizabeth saw Mary coming, she ran to welcome her, and the baby inside her leapt for joy at the sound of Mary's greeting.

Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and said to Mary, "Of all women you are the most blessed; and blessed is the child you will have

because you believe in the power of God, and he has chosen you to be the mother of our savior."

DISCUSSION

When Gabriel appeared to Mary, he told her that Elizabeth and her husband, Zechariah, were expecting a baby. Mary was surprised by this news because both Elizabeth and her husband were quite old and had never been able to have children. But Mary knew that nothing was impossible for God!

After the angel's visit, Mary immediately set off to visit Elizabeth. Mary's first thoughts were for her cousin, and being generous and kind, she was always ready to help in whatever way she could.

When Elizabeth and Mary met, Elizabeth was filled with understanding by the Holy Spirit; she, too, knew that nothing is impossible for God. Elizabeth also became aware that God had chosen Mary to be the mother of his son.

What do you think Mary and Elizabeth would have talked about together? They probably talked about the good news the angel brought them, and marveled together at the power of God.

Both of them were expecting their first child, and probably shared their feelings of excitement and joy as they waited for them to be born. Elizabeth and Mary knew that they had been chosen by God and that their children would be blessed by God in a very special way.
