The two great commandments

INTRODUCTION

The scribes were very religious and carefully obeyed every commandment of the Jewish law. They also spent much of their time studying the scriptures. One day a scribe came to Jesus and asked him an important question.

SIGN OF THE CROSS

LIGHT THE CANDLES

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

To welcome today's Gospel sing Acclamation 1.

GOSPEL (MARK 12:28-34)

One of the scribes came to Jesus and asked, "Which of God's commandments is the most important?" Jesus answered, "To love God with all your heart and all your mind and all your strength, and to love others as much as you love yourself. These commandments come before all others." Then the scribe said to Jesus, "What you have said is true, because nothing is more important than loving God and loving our neighbors."

Seeing that the scribe was wise and good, Jesus said to him, "My friend, what you have said will please God and keep you close to him."

DISCUSSION

To love God and to love our neighbor as ourselves are the most important commandments.

Who is our neighbor? Jesus did not only mean the person living next door, or people that you know! Every person we meet is our neighbor, and Jesus expects us to treat him or her in the same way as we would like to be treated ourselves.

Why might the scribe have asked such a question? Many of the scribes paid more attention to the rules and regulations of the law, rather than the things which were truly important, like loving God and our neighbor. The scribe had listened to Jesus preach and was probably curious to know what was most important to Jesus.

Jesus wants us to put our love for God and for other people before anything else in our lives. What will happen if we do this? Like the scribe in the story, our lives will be pleasing to God and we will stay close to his love as he leads us through life. At the end of time, the reward for our goodness will be to share everlasting life with him in heaven.

Jesus once said, "Love one another as I have loved you." He showed his love by caring for everyone he met; spending time listening and talking to them; helping the sick; making the lonely feel welcome and loved; by being forgiving and not judging others. Jesus has shown us many ways to put the two greatest commandments into action in our lives.

ACTIVITY

Use large sheets of paper to make two banners. Cut out the individual letters which make up the words of the two greatest commandments. Ask the children to color these brightly, and help them to assemble them in the correct order before sticking them onto the banners.
